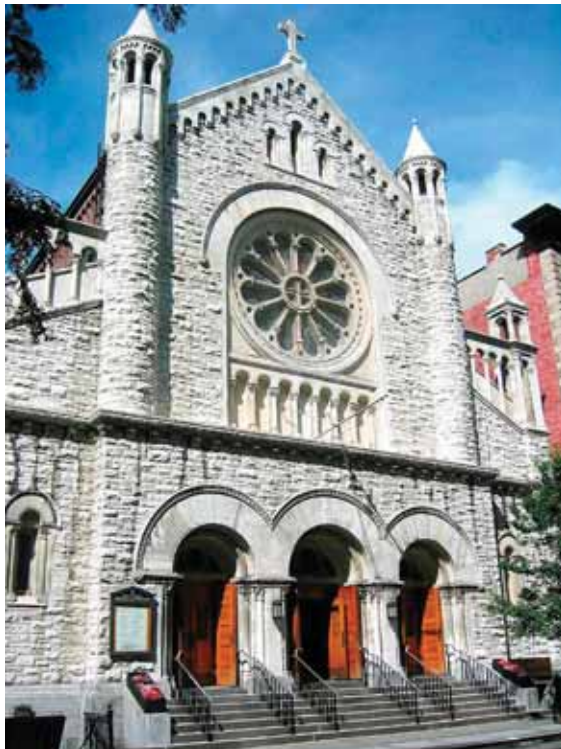

Pastor's Letter
Notas del Pastor

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Ascension,

This weekend is set aside as Presidents Day Weekend -- on this weekend we give special honor to George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. Curiously, the month of February is set aside as Black History Month. Black History Month grew out of a vision of liberating a beleaguered people so they could take pride in their accomplishments. The month of February was chosen because of the birthdays of two great figures central to the freedom and liberation of African Americans in the United States: Abraham Lincoln (February 12th) and Frederick Douglass (February 14th.) This vision sought to unleash the fetters that bound the American black community, whose identity has been burdened by so many misrepresentations, whose lives have been plagued by poverty: a people whose self-concept was damaged by a stilted sense of who they were and where they belonged in a society that often ignored them and often times, thought them to be worthless. The goal of Black History Month was to expand the imaginations of people everywhere, no matter their temporal conditions.

This past Wednesday, when ashes were imposed on our foreheads, we began our forty day Lenten journey - the journey that hopefully leads us to a profound celebration of the Paschal Mystery. As we enter the Season of Lent, we should remember some of the great African American leaders who forged the historical, social, cultural pathways we enjoy today. As we accompany Jesus into the desert on this First Sunday of Lent and experience the depth of his courage, his loneliness and his temptation, we should question and reflect on our own spiritual journey with God and seek answers that will enlighten everyone about God's love for all people.

This has been a year of headlines about young lives tragically lost and accusations of police violence. A wide range of social problems await advocacy and political leadership. Homelessness affects countless young lives and warps sensitive consciences. Whatever trials come, we survive because God is still in control and because he has empowered strong women and men to work for justice and peace yesterday, today and forever. President Lincoln certainly had the greatest moral accomplishment of any President, abolishing slavery while maintaining national sovereignty at a time when those forces worked against each other. During this Season of Lent, we ask the Spirit to open our eyes to see the goodness of God in the faces of all people around us. We ask the Spirit to open our hearts to the challenge of love and all that God has yet to teach us. I hope this will be a blessed Lenten Season for all.

Queridos Feligreses y Amigos de la Ascensión,

Este fin de semana está apartado como el fin de semana de los presidentes. En este fin de semana honramos especialmente a George Washington y Abraham Lincoln. Curiosamente, el mes de febrero está apartado como el mes de la herencia afro-americana. El mes de la herencia afro-americana es resultado de una visión de liberación de gente oprimida para que pudieran tener orgullo de sus logros. El mes de febrero fue escogido a causa de los cumpleaños de dos grandes figuras centrales en la libertad y liberación de afro-americanos en los Estados Unidos: Abraham Lincoln (12 de febrero) y Frederick Douglass (14 de febrero). Esta visión buscaba desatar las cadenas que ataban a la colonia afro-americana, cuya identidad ha sido cargada de tantas distorsiones, cuyas vidas han sido acosados por la pobreza: un pueblo cuyo auto-concepto fue dañado por un sentido exagerado de quiénes eran y dónde pertenecían en una sociedad que a menudo los ignoraba y en muchas ocasiones pensaba que no tenían valor. La meta del mes de la herencia afro-americana era de aumentar las imaginaciones de la gente en todas partes, sin importar sus condiciones temporales.

Este miércoles pasado cuando se nos impusieron cenizas en nuestras frentes, comenzamos nuestro viaje cuaresmal de cuarenta días – el viaje que esperamos nos lleva a una profunda celebración del misterio pascual. Cuando entremos en la temporada de Cuaresma, debemos recordar algunos de los grandes dirigentes afro-americanos que forjaron los caminos históricos, sociales y culturales de que disfrutamos hoy día. Mientras que acompañamos a Jesús al desierto en este primer domingo de Cuaresma y experimentamos la profundidad de su valor, su soledad y su tentación, debemos interrogar y reflexionar sobre nuestro propio viaje espiritual con Dios y buscar respuestas que iluminan a todos sobre el amor de Dios para toda la gente.

Éste ha sido un año de noticias sobre vidas jóvenes trágicamente perdidas y acusaciones de violencia policiaca. Una amplia serie de problemas sociales esperan defensa y dirección política. El desamparo afecta a un sinnúmero de vidas jóvenes y distorsiona las conciencias sensitivas. Cualquiera de las pruebas que se presenten, sobrevivimos porque todavía Dios está en control y porque él le ha dado valor a mujeres y hombres fuertes para que luchen por la justicia y la paz, ayer, hoy y por siempre. El presidente Lincoln seguramente obtuvo el logro moral más grande de ningún presidente, suprimiendo la esclavitud, mientras mantenía la soberanía nacional en un tiempo en que esas fuerzas luchaban una en contra de la otra. Durante esta temporada de Cuaresma, le pedimos al Espíritu Santo que nos abra los ojos para que veamos a Dios en la cara de todas las personas a nuestro alrededor. Le pedimos al Espíritu Santo que abra nuestros corazones al reto del amor y a todo lo que Dios todavía nos quiere enseñar. Espero que ésta sea una bendecida temporada de Cuaresma para todos.

On June 18, 2015 the Vatican issued Laudato Si', Praise Be to You, Pope Francis's encyclical on caring for creation. The phrase "praised be" is taken from a famous creation canticle by St. Francis of Assisi as he thanked God for the beauty of creation. At the core of Pope Francis's message is the idea of "integral ecology," - that how we relate to one another, especially the poor, and how we relate to the environment are intimately connected. 

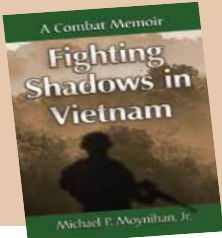
