Pastor's Letter
Notas del Pastor

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Ascension,

As most know, the Liturgical Year is broken up by Seasons. The Seasons are Advent, Christmas, Lent, Season of the Easter Triduum, and Easter. All other times are considered "ordinary." In the days of yesteryear, in the days before the Second Vatican Council, there were three Sundays leading up to Ash Wednesday, used as a reminder that Lent was drawing near.

Septuagesima was the name for the ninth Sunday before Easter. The term was often applied to the three-week period before Lent and the Season ended on Shrove Tuesday, the day before Ash Wednesday, when Lent began. This period was also known as the pre-Lenten season. The other two Sundays in that period of the liturgical year were called Sexagesima and Quinquagesima (which would have been today). Septuagesima comes from the Latin word for "seventieth" with Sexagesima and Quinquagesima equating to "sixtieth" and "fiftieth", respectively. They were patterned after the Latin word for the season of Lent, Quadragesima, which means "fortieth", as Lent is forty days long. Simply put, the season was a countdown, reminding us that Lent and Easter were rapidly approaching. Now there is no such reminder. Having said that, the Lenten Season is rapidly approaching.

The annual observance of Lent is the special season that prepares us to celebrate worthily the Paschal Mystery. Through its twofold theme of repentance and baptism, the season of Lent hopefully prepares both the catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the Paschal Mystery. Catechumens are led to the Sacraments of initiation by means of the rite of election, the scrutinies, and catechesis. Lent runs from Ash Wednesday until the evening Mass of the Lord's Last Supper on Holy Thursday.

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. It is a day of universal fast and abstinence. Ashes will be imposed after the homily at each of the Masses. On Ash Wednesday, Masses will be celebrated at 7a.m., 8:30a.m. (with the school children,) 12:00Noon, 6:00PMp.m. Mass in Spanish will be celebrated at 7:30p.m. Ashes will only be imposed during the Masses.

I pray that this will be a holy season for all. Peace, Fr. Kearney

Queridos Feligreses y Amigos de la Ascensión,

Como casi todos saben, el año litúrgico está dividido en temporadas. Las temporadas son Adviento, Navidad, Cuaresma, la temporada del Triduo Pascual y la Pascua Florida. Todos los otros tiempos son considerados "ordinarios." En los días de antaño, en los días antes del Concilio Vaticano II, había tres domingos que precedían al Miércoles de Ceniza, para recordarnos que la Cuaresma se acercaba.

Septuagésimo era el nombre para el noveno domingo antes de la Pascua. El término se aplicaba casi siempre al período de semanas antes de la Cuaresma y la temporada terminaba el martes de carnaval, el día antes del Miércoles de Ceniza cuando comenzaba la Cuaresma. Este período también era conocido como la temporada pre-cuaresmal. Los otros dos domingos de ese período del año litúrgico eran llamados sexagésimo y quincuagésimo (que hubiera sido hoy). Septuagésimo viene de la palabra en latín para "setenta" y sexagésimo y quincuagésimo equivalente a "sesenta" y "cincuenta," respectivamente. Fueron modeladas como la palabra en latín para la temporada de Cuaresma, "cuadragésima" que significa "cuarenta," ya que la Cuaresma dura cuarenta días. En pocas palabras, la temporada era una cuenta atrás, recordándonos que la Cuaresma (y la Pascua) se acercaban rápidamente. Ahora no hay tal recordatorio. Habiendo dicho esto, la temporada de la Cuaresma se acerca rápidamente.

La observancia anual de la Cuaresma es la temporada especial que nos prepara para celebrar fervorosamente el misterio pascual. A través del doble tema de arrepentimiento y bautismo, esperamos que la temporada de la Cuaresma nos prepare a los catecúmenos al igual que a los fieles para celebrar el misterio pascual. Los catecúmenos son llevados a los sacramentos de iniciación a través del rito de la elección, los escrutinios y la catequesis. La Cuaresma transcurre desde el Miércoles de Ceniza hasta la tarde de la misa de la Última Cena del Señor el Jueves Santo.

Este miércoles es Miércoles de Ceniza. Es un día de ayuno y abstinencia universal. Las cenizas serán impuestas en cada misa después de la homilía. El día de Miércoles de Ceniza las misas serán celebradas a las 7 de la mañana, a las 8:30 de la mañana (con los niños de la escuela), al mediodía, a las 6 de la noche y la misa en español será celebrada a las 7:30 de la noche. Las cenizas serán impuestas solamente durante las misas.

Oro para que ésta sea una temporada sagrada para todos. Paz, Padre Kearney

ASH WEDNESDAY, February 10th, is the beginning of the season of Lent. Masses will be celebrated at

- 7:00 AM (English)
- 8:30 AM (English)
- 12:00 Noon (English)
- 6:00 PM (English)
- 7:30 PM (Spanish)

- Ashes are distributed during the Mass, not before or after the Mass.
- Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. *No meat should be eaten by anyone 14 years old and older. Fast means that only one full meal may be eaten, and the two smaller meals should not equal the full meal. Nothing should be eaten between meals. Fasting obliges all Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.*

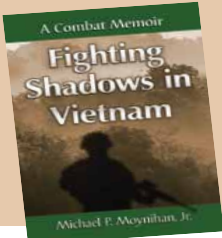
