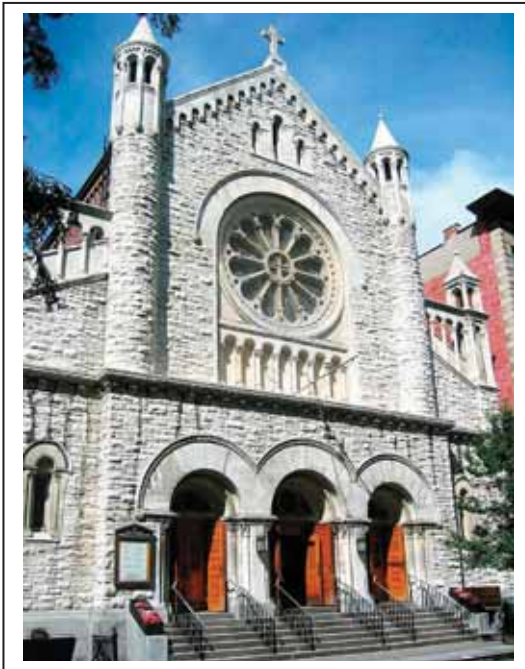

Pastor's Letter
Notas del Pastor

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Ascension,

On Tuesday and Wednesday of this upcoming week, we will celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints and the Commemoration of All Souls.

All Saints Day, the day on which Catholics celebrate all the saints, known and unknown, is a surprisingly old feast. It arose out of the Christian tradition of celebrating the martyrdom of saints on the anniversary of their martyrdom. When martyrdoms increased during the persecutions of the late Roman Empire, local dioceses instituted a common feast day in order to ensure that all martyrs, known and unknown, were properly honored. The current date of November 1 was instituted by Pope Gregory III (731-741), when he consecrated a chapel to all the martyrs in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome and ordered an annual celebration. This celebration was originally confined to the diocese of Rome, but Pope Gregory IV (827-844) extended the feast to the entire Church and ordered it to be celebrated on November 1.

All Souls' Day commemorates the faithful departed. The Roman Catholic celebration of All Souls is associated with the doctrine that the souls of the faithful, who at the time of their death, have not been cleansed from the temporal punishment due to venial sins and from attachment to mortal sins cannot immediately attain the beatific vision in heaven, and that they may be helped to do so by prayer and through the celebration of the Mass. In other words, when they died, they had not yet attained full sanctification, a requirement for entrance into Heaven.

In reality, these two days, All Saints and All Souls should better be celebrated as one great feast. What we celebrate in fact, on these two days, is the doctrine, or the belief in the Communion of Saints. We believe that the communion of saints is made up of three groups of people, those on pilgrimage (us), those who are in a process of purification (purgatory), and those who are in heaven, experiencing the beatific vision – seeing God face to face. This, in fact, is what is celebrated on November 1st and November 2nd. In the Book of Maccabees, we are reminded that it is a good and holy thing to pray for the dead, 2 Maccabees (43-46). For that reason, we pray in a special way during this entire month of November for all those who have died. The Mass schedule for both days is in this bulletin as well.

Queridos Feligreses y Amigos de la Ascensión,

El martes y el miércoles de la próxima semana estaremos celebrando la Solemnidad de Todos los Santos y la Conmemoración de Todos los Difuntos.

El Día de Todos los Santos, el día en que los católicos celebramos a todos los santos conocidos y desconocidos, es una fiesta asombrosamente antigua. Surgió de la tradición cristiana de celebrar el martirio de los santos en el aniversario de su martirio. Cuando los martirios aumentaron durante la persecución del antiguo imperio romano, las diócesis locales instituyeron un día de fiesta común para asegurarse de que todos los mártires, conocidos y desconocidos, fueran propiamente honrados. La fecha actual del 1ro de noviembre fue instituida por el Papa Gregorio III (731-741), cuando éste consagró una capilla para todos los mártires en la Basílica de San Pedro en Roma y ordenó una celebración anual. La celebración fue originalmente confinada a la diócesis de Roma, pero el Papa Gregorio IV (827-844) extendió la fiesta a toda la Iglesia y ordenó que se celebrara el 1ro de noviembre.

El Día de Todos los Difuntos conmemora a los fieles fallecidos. La celebración católica romana del Día de Todos los Difuntos se asocia a la doctrina de que las almas de los fieles, que a la hora de su muerte no han sido limpiadas del castigo temporal a causa de pecados veniales y de ataduras a pecados mortales, no pueden obtener inmediatamente la visión beatífica en el cielo y que puedan ser ayudados a hacerlo a través de la oración y a través de la celebración de la misa. En otras palabras, cuando murieron, no habían todavía conseguido la completa santificación, un requerimiento para entrar en el cielo.

En realidad, esos dos días, Todos los Santos y Todos los Difuntos, deberían ser celebrados juntos como una gran fiesta. Lo que, en efecto, celebramos en estos dos días es la doctrina o la creencia en la comunión de los santos. Creemos que la comunión de los santos está compuesta de tres grupos de personas, aquellos en peregrinación (nosotros), aquellos que están en un proceso de purificación (el purgatorio) y aquellos que están en el cielo, experimentando la visión beatífica – viendo a Dios cara a cara. Esto, de hecho, es lo que se celebra el 1ro de noviembre y el 2 de noviembre. En el Libro de los Macabeos, se nos recuerda que es algo bueno y santo orar por los difuntos, 2 Macabeos (43-46). Por esa razón, oramos de una manera especial durante todo el mes de noviembre por aquellos que han fallecido. El horario para las dos misas está en el boletín también.

Full of Grace: Journeys of LGBT Catholics is an interview-based docu-drama that explores the intersection of faith and sexual identity through the first person accounts of LGBT Catholics. The play is composed entirely of interviews from over 50 individuals including clergy, religious and lay people spanning in age from 19-85 from across the United States. The play explore themes such as inclusion and exclusion, self-acceptance and shame, integrity, family, relationships, marriage and family as well as individual experiences of God and church. These are the untold stories of disciples seeking a place at the table and the fullness of life to which God calls them.

Headlines often tell of a pitched battle between the Catholic Church and the LGBT community. But under the divisive rhetoric are real human dramas: individuals, families and communities striving to be faithful to God and to their inmost identities.

Full of Grace is a simple project. We turned on the microphone and listened as LGBT Catholics and their families told their stories of love and faith. Now we tell these stories of witness and faithfulness to reveal their struggles, joys, surprises and gifts. These stories challenge each of us to consider the risk of being faithful to your own heart despite the cost.

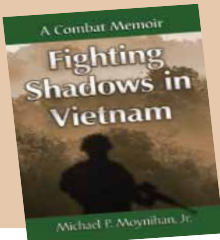
